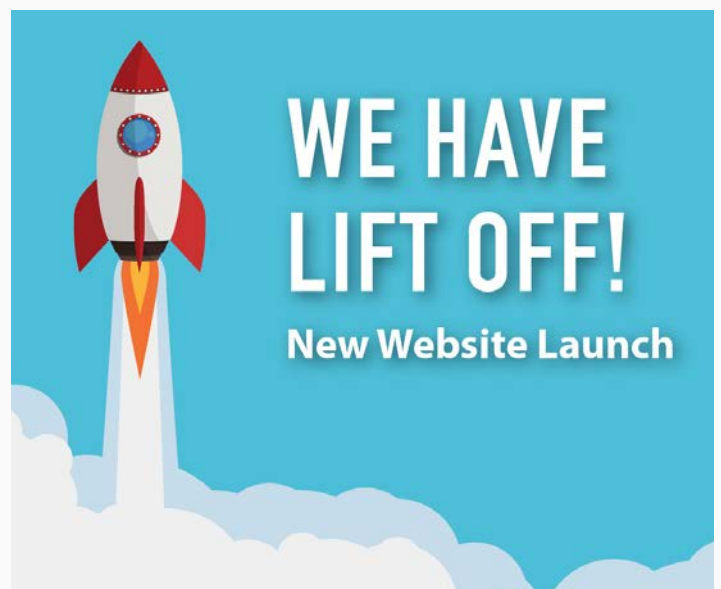

CURRENT STUDY STATUS

The ASSET Study is open at **10** paediatric children hospitals across Australia and New Zealand.

There are currently **259** participants enrolled on the study.

STUDY PUBLICATION

The ASSET team are working on a publication that aims to report on how health-related quality of life (HRQoL) of children with leukaemia and the emotional well-being of their parents, changes throughout the first year of a child's treatment. It also aims to discuss the feasibility and acceptability of monitoring children's HRQoL and parent's emotional well-being throughout treatment.

We look forward to sharing more information regarding this research once the paper is published.

QUALITY OF LIFE, EDUCATIONAL AND HEALTH ECONOMICS SUB-STUDIES

The aims of the ASSET sub-studies are to help us understand how much the toxicities that happen during treatment impact on the quality of life of young patients and their families, the impact on development and education, and the cost of managing these toxicities. This will allow us to develop better support strategies for young patients and their families.

We currently have **81** parents and **10** children enrolled and participating. 21 new parent participants participated in the study since the start of 2020.
